Handbook for a Long-Term Individual Volunteer McCurdy Ministries Community Center

Revised November 2020

All McCurdy volunteers must be safe sanctuary trained and certified. Training is available on our website: www.mccurdy.org.

McCurdy Ministries Community Center (MMCC) benefits greatly from the services of volunteers. Many people give of their time and skills to strengthen our program and improve our facilities. The satisfaction of serving as a Long-Term Individual Volunteer is evidenced by the volunteers who return year after year.

One of the wonderful aspects of McCurdy Ministries Community Center's setting is the opportunity to interact with nature as well as the Hispanic, Native American, and Anglo cultures, history, art, and science. The Española Valley is surrounded on the east by the Sangre de Cristo Mountains and on the west by the Jemez Mountains. Flowing through the valley is the Rio Grande River. The mountains and rivers provide wonderful opportunities for hiking, rafting, and enjoyment of God's creation. Despite the geographic and cultural richness, 32% of our population lives under the Federal Poverty Line, 22% of adults over 25 have not graduated from high school or earned a GED and 60% of our children are being raised by their grandparents.

Since 1912 McCurdy Ministries Community Center has been making God's difference in the Española Valley and we deeply appreciate our Long Term Volunteers who help us to fulfill our mission year after year. MMCC's mission is to "create hope and empower the lives of children, youth, adults, and families through education, life skills, and faith-based programs."

Long-Term Individual Volunteers serve on an individual basis (or sometimes together as a couple or with a friend). We accept individual volunteers throughout the year and work closely with each volunteer to determine the best time frame and volunteer assignment. If Long Term Individual Volunteers serve for at least two weeks in a fiscal year there is no charge for housing.

Possible Volunteer Tasks

- Office: Volunteers assist office staff. Duties may involve typing, computer data entry, making copies, filing, shredding, trimming and counting box tops, writing thank you notes, and preparing mailings.
- **After-School Care (ASC):** Volunteers staying a longer period are preferred for these positions as they work closely with the students. This would involve assisting the regular ASC staff in the supervision of children from Pre-K through 6th grade. This includes helping to prepare snacks, playing with and reading to students as well as helping with homework when needed.
- **Maintenance:** Volunteers perform electrical work, plumbing, woodwork, mechanical repairs, yard work, and cleaning as needed and according to the volunteer's skills.
- **Tutoring:** Volunteers act as classroom assistants under the direction of McCurdy Charter School teachers.
- Food Service Helper: If working all day there, the volunteer will help prepare meals and will assist in serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner for our preschoolers and our volunteers. If only needed for food service, the volunteer will arrive 15 minutes before serving begins to help our staff serve our volunteers and students. This job requires that you comply with all health rules, including hair nets, gloves, aprons, etc.
- Substitute or Help in After-School Care: Subs as needed in an emergency. A paid staff member will be in After-School Care at all times.

Our volunteers need to be flexible in their work, just as all our staff is required to be flexible in their work. Over time we have learned that God works in amazing ways in unexpected work assignments so we hope you will be open to new experiences especially when we are confronted with emergency needs.

Housing

Retreat Center Rooms: Volunteers are housed in the Pilling-Robinson Retreat Center. Each room has two of the following: a single bed, dresser, desk, and closet. There is a washbasin and mirror in each room. Retreat Center baths consist of a tub/shower, toilet, and ceiling/heating fan and are shared between two rooms. **Note that pets and hot plates are not allowed in the Retreat Center** but there are kitchen and kitchenette areas available for your use. There is a small refrigerator, microwave, coffee maker, and toaster in each lounge. The kitchens in the NE and SW apartments contain a stove and regular-sized refrigerator. While living in the retreat center you will be living **close** to others so compromise and cooperation are important.

RVs: There are two RV hook-ups, if available, which can be used during the spring, summer and fall. Temperatures in December through February are not suitable for RV living.

Hours: To be considered a full-time volunteer, you must work 30 hours per week and normal work hours are 8 AM to noon and 1 to 3 PM. Even though volunteers are on a full work schedule, there are many opportunities to enjoy the unique geographic and cultural characteristics of Northern New Mexico. Occasional time off may be requested from the executive director and is usually approved. Please note that MMCC has a generous holiday schedule (three days at Thanksgiving, ten days at Christmas, two days at Easter, and five days at Spring Break plus several other holidays such as Labor Day) and when the staff is off on holiday so are our volunteers. Occasionally, volunteers acting as Retreat Center Hosts are asked to do VIM Team check-ins on holidays.

Climate: Although the climate in Española is generally temperate, winter clothing is needed at times. Summer days can be hot, but nights are cool. The elevation in Española is approximately 5,800 feet, but elevation varies greatly throughout the region. There are four distinct seasons, with low humidity year-round. Lows are listed at 15°F and highs 90°F.

Travel: Volunteers are responsible for their travel expenses to and from McCurdy Ministries Community Center. You also will need to provide your transportation to run errands and for sightseeing.

Insurance: Volunteers must provide proof of health insurance and car insurance if they have a car on campus.

Other Considerations: Volunteers should consider whether or not they are up to the demands of the work they will be asked to do. In addition, our volunteers live and work in communal settings so each volunteer must assess whether these living and work situations fit their personality.

Articles/Services Provided by McCurdy Ministries

Linens: Sheets, pillows, pillowcases, quilts, towels, and washcloths are provided for your use while staying at Pilling-Robinson Retreat Center.

Laundry: Washers and dryers are available for personal laundry at 50 cents per load to wash and 50 cents to dry. Volunteers are asked to launder the linens and towels they use while staying at the Retreat Center. Detergent and dryer sheets are kept on hand for your use. **Note: Please have laundry completed by 9:30 p.m.** because the noise generated affects adjacent living quarters. When planning an early morning departure, please make arrangements for another volunteer to do your laundry of linens/towels.

Telephone: A telephone (505-753-7221, ext.232) is provided in the main lounge for adult use. To make a long-distance call, you must use a phone card.

Visitors Policy: Long-term volunteers may welcome visitors needing a separate room in the Retreat Center for three nights' free lodging once per year. After three nights, rent will be charged at the rate of \$30 per night per person.

Drug and Alcohol Policy: McCurdy Ministries Community Center is a **SMOKE-FREE AND DRUG-FREE** campus. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PROHIBITED** on campus and during off-campus MMCC activities.

Security: Retreat Center security is everyone's concern. Exterior doors are locked at all times. Do not prop open the end or inside fire doors. You will be issued an outside door key and a gate key in addition to your room key. Also, please do not use the south entrance unless you are housed in the south wing. To help secure the campus, the gate at McCurdy Road near the playground will be closed each afternoon after most of the students have left the campus, but you will be given a key to that gate. All other gates are locked at all times.

We suggest you take security measures to protect your car against vandalism. Lock your car and park it in well-lighted areas, either behind the Retreat Center or in the fenced lot in the back. Please take care when parking in the fenced lot to make room for as many cars as possible. Do not park cars in the lawn areas or block any Retreat Center exits. There are sensing lights in the rear of the building. Report any acts of vandalism. The Española Police Department is the only security force available by dialing 911. We are not responsible for damage to your vehicles.

Articles to Bring: Suggested items include an alarm clock, raincoat, umbrella, comfortable clothes, personal toiletry articles, personal glass for washroom use, comfortable walking shoes (closed-toed shoes for working because the grounds are rough in spots and the buildings are far apart), and clothing for both warm and cold weather (our elevation is 5,600 feet and we do have snow in fall, winter and spring). Optional items include a desk lamp, fan, throw rug, bath mat, and radio.

Pharmacies: CVS, Walgreen's, and Wal-Mart are all in Española to meet your prescription needs. We also recommend Fairview Pharmacy (a Good Neighbor Pharmacy). There is a local hospital and two Urgent Care providers.

Driving Directions: To determine your best route to McCurdy Ministries Community Center go to our website at www.mccurdy.org and click on the Contact Us Tab at the top of the page. There you will find our address, a Google Map link to our campus, and directions to our administrative offices of campus. Of course, you can use your GPS. Our address is 362A S. McCurdy Road, Española, NM 87532. If you are using your GPS, please double-check your route on a map.

Local points of interest

Please note all entrance fees are the responsibility of the participants. Time estimates are for round trips.

- **Pueblos:** San Juan, Santa Clara, San Ildefonso, Pojoaque, Picuris, Taos, Nambé (half to full day) When Native American ceremonies are held, we encourage visiting groups to take the afternoon off to observe the dances. Pictures are usually not allowed ~ you must have permission from the pueblo or your camera will be confiscated.
- Chimayo: Hispanic weaving and Santuario de Chimayo (2 to 3 hours)
- **Bandelier National Monument:** cliff dwellings and hiking trails (half day)
- Los Alamos: the atomic city, Bradbury Science Museum (3 hours)
- Santa Fe: oldest continuously occupied capital in the new world, numerous museums, shops, galleries, and restaurants (half day)
- **Taos:** Taos has galleries, shops, museums, and restaurants and is a Spanish colonial town. Taos Pueblo is a few miles north of town (half day)
- Truchas-Trampas-Penasco: the high road to Taos, Hispanic mountain villages, and scenery (half day)
- **Ghost Ranch:** museum, hiking trail, labyrinth, Abiquiu and Echo Amphitheater (half day)

- **Pecos wilderness:** high mountain hikes (one day)
- **Jemez Pueblo and Springs:** high country trip (one day)

Restaurants: There are a variety of fast food and dine-in restaurants in Española, as well as several that serve good Northern New Mexico cuisine including Angelina's, El Paragua, and La Cocina. We also recommend Rancho de Chimayo in Chimayo.

All our local United Methodist Churches welcome our volunteers:

- Visit some or all of the United Methodist Churches in Northern New Mexico:
 - o **Santa Cruz UMC**, across the street from McCurdy, built in 1953, and used for many years by McCurdy for chapel services.
 - o **Valley View UMC** (and the Española Valley Hospital, started on the McCurdy campus and operated by the United Methodist Church until 1977).
 - o **Alcalde UMC**, where a plaza school was opened in 1917 and operated with eight grades in three rooms until 1980. The church was built in the 1950s. La Loma Vista, the cemetery close to the church, is owned by the United Methodist Church and has served as the only Protestant cemetery in the area.
 - **Velarde**, where the work began in 1912. The original building, Hauser Memorial Chapel, is still used as the church. (This tour will take about one-half day.)
