# Successful Pre-K Site Visit

The annual FOCUS 4-Star Verification site visit took place on May 1, 2023.

The notice of Star 4-Level verification was also shared with NM CYFD Licensing Unit.

### Major Pre-K Grant Award

We are pleased to announce that The Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD) has informed us that our Grant Application to provide New Mexico Prekindergarten (Pre-K) program services has been approved as set forth in a letter dated June 9, 2023.

New Mexico Pre-K is a core program of ECECD and is a critical part of the early childhood education and care system. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 9-29-8(B), ECECD is mandated to "coordinate and align an early childhood education and care system to: (1) include child care, pre-kindergarten, early pre-kindergarten, home visitation, early head start, head start, early childhood special education and early intervention and family support; and (2) provide New Mexico families with consistent access to appropriate care and education services."

The letter further stated that our role as a NM Pre-K provider is critical toward ensuring ECECD fulfills this mandate. New Mexico Pre-K Grant Award Information: The Pre-K grant award for McCurdy Schools of Northern NM Pre-K is for 20 Extended Pre-K Slots for 1080 Pre-K instructional hours as set forth in the contract we have signed.

We invite families to contact Denise London, business manager at McCurdy Schools of Northern NM by calling 505-753-7221, ext. 264 for more information and for the registration/enrollment packet. PLEASE NOTE that <u>no</u> <u>fee</u> will be charged for participation in the program. We run a 4-year old Pre-K program and as such, students must be 4 years old by September 1, 2023. No exceptions can be made. As of June 13, 2023, there are 11 slots available.

## Notes from the MMCC executive director

"For everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." Ecclesiastes 3:1

Today I share that, after much prayer and discernment, I have submitted my letter of retirement and; therefore, resignation as Executive Director of McCurdy Schools of Northern NM/McCurdy Ministries Community Center. After almost 32 years (1989-2023) of being blessed to be a part of this faith community/family, I have found myself contemplating on the scripture verse I just shared. Words cannot express my gratitude for the opportunity to have been a part of McCurdy's mission for so many years and for the support shown to me during all this time. Hired as a teacher in Middle School and then moving on to High

School Principal, all the while raising my children as a single mother, and watching them flourish; being a part of other children's lives; and being a part of the staff and community collaboration that has transpired over my 30+ years at McCurdy has blessed me in ways too many to enumerate!

In 2010, I returned, after about 3 years from having left to direct a community-based Early Childhood home visiting program. As superintendent, at that point; and then; in 2012 as McCurdy School, the Mission, closed and made it possible for McCurdy Charter School to open its operations on our campus, becoming the executive director for McCurdy Ministries, I have experienced "...for everything, there is a season..."

At each juncture and each transition, there was never doubt in my mind that My Father was in control, and yet, as our human nature sometimes overwhelms us, I did struggle with thoughts that I was not doing enough or good enough to further His purpose and vision for those with whom He allowed me to be involved. The many people that He sent my way to help guide my own children, my work, and my leadership: co-teachers; administrators, board members, active and involved parents; community agency partners, and family; were my gifts from Him that provided strength and the "village that it takes to raise a child!"

I want to share with you some passages in the Bible that have sustained me and helped reaffirm that my strength only comes through God's grace! And that is true whether we speak of one's individual strengths or a mission in service such as McCurdy. # Plans moving forward for our "Live, Work, Educate, Recreate Planned Community" on campus

Dear Friends,

The good news is growing in getting the redevelopment of the McCurdy campus started! First, we owe thanks to Sen. Ben Ray Lujan for securing a \$1,050,000 HUD affordable housing grant for 2023 to reduce the amount that Homewise, a nonprofit home developer, will pay for McCurdy's northern 10 acres and increase the amount we receive to \$1,400,000. In addition, for 2024 we have been informed that a \$1,500,000 grant to the USDA Community Facilities Program on McCurdy's behalf is a priority for the senator so now we are praying that the Senate Appropriations Committee agrees with Sen. Lujan and our project makes it into the 2024 Federal Budget! Please consider adding this grant to your prayer list! These funds will be applied to the

construction of the new program building and the rehab of Bachman into a new retreat center

At the beginning of the year, President Biden issued an Executive Order to the Environmental Protection Agency, requiring each EPA Region in the United States to choose a rural community that has Brownfield, EPA Superfund Sites and Water Bureau Projects and bring all EPA resources, while coordinating all Federal resources, to bear on the community. Due to the work McCurdy has been doing with the EPA, Española has been chosen as the rural community for Region 6 and we are already seeing the fruits of this partnership. The EPA set up meetings for McCurdy with the NM Drinking Water State Revolving Fund and the Clean Water Revolving Fund which in cooperation with the City of Española can provide significant grants and funding for the redevelopment of McCurdy's campus.

The first sign of major changes on the McCurdy campus will be remediation and demolition of seven buildings including Blake, Herrick, Library Annex, the elementary

## **Beginning Our New Beginning**

First stages of Deconstruction to make room for additional programs and beautiful new buildings.

As you may know the oldest buildings at McCurdy are over 100 years old. We will be able to save and modernize several key buildings, such as the Chapel and Bachman Hall, but several others will need to come down because they are no longer safe spaces or cannot be modernized effectively.

To begin our progress, volunteers from four churches in Kansas, with specialized skills, took down an adobe garage across from the administration buildings. By removing the garage and realigning the fence, we are able to increase our parking for the Cole Building by 30 percent. This makes the Cole Building much more user friendly. Thanks for the great work, Kansas volunteers from the following Wichita District Churches: University UMC, Andover UMC, East Heights UMC, and First UMC Wichita!













school and several smaller buildings. These buildings are past their useful life and their removal will make the development of a right sized and energy efficient campus for McCurdy possible. Many, many thanks to the New Mexico Environment Department who granted \$186,000 to pay for the remediation of these buildings, to the Anchorum/ St. Vincent Foundation who granted \$100,000 to pay for demolition, and to State Sen. Leo Jaramillo and State Representative Susan Herrera who allocated a \$200,000 Capital Outlay Grant for this project. At this point, the EPA is helping McCurdy secure the remaining funding to start the remediation and demolition of these funds. What a demonstration of "it takes a village!"

McCurdy has also been chosen to participate in a Brownfield Brightfield program which will help us develop a plan and secure funding to decommission the campus steam plant and install solar, wind, battery storage and energy efficiency systems that will greatly reduce the utilities McCurdy pays and create a smaller green footprint for our campus.

In June, I submitted a Lever for Change \$1,000,000 grant which will provide funds for new programs and capital updates to our campus. In 2024, 250 \$1,000,000 grants will be awarded to nonprofits like ours that have budgets between \$1,000,000 to \$5,000,000 and are doing racial, environmental and economic justice work. Feel free to add this grant to your prayer list as well!

The next step will be applying to the USDA Community Facilities grant/loan program in July and August. We are making progress and I very much appreciate your interest, prayers and support of this work!

In the late 1930's, those of us who remember the depression must admit that those were days of trials and tribulation. We still attended school with great determination. There were some of us who would say that if the mission schools had not existed, we would not have had any kind of education. Money was one

of the problems.
Money was hard to
come by, and we
all must admit that
money controls our
lives. Without money,
McCurdy School
could not exist. Of
course, the money had

to come from somewhere. Money was a problem at the church headquarters in Dayton, Ohio, from which support for the teachers and the school came. The amount of money that we students paid to live, eat, and be schooled was very small in proportion to the amount it cost to operate the school.

There was a time when money didn't come from the national headquarters of the United Brethren Church so, in order for us to have food at our table, the superintendent of the school had to go to one of the stores that had been in business since territorial days and buy, on credit,

the staples that we needed.

It was a critical time for all concerned, both the staff and the students. We saw a dark cloud before us. How were we going to stay in school with the school in such a financial situation? We students were sent to school hoping for some miracle to happen so our folks could produce

> some money to keep us in school. We were allowed to pay by doing chores around the school. The amount of work we performed didn't produce any money for the

school's finances, so it must have been the dedication and prayers of the staff which kept it going.

The next year we were better prepared, and things improved. We learned we could not live by bread alone. We had to put our faith to work. The Lord has been great to those of us who went to McCurdy in those early days and later sent our children there.

## Project Cariño Serves Students, Community

Looking back over Project Cariño's work over the past school year, our growth and experiences have been many! Bill and I started the year on our own, only two full-time employees available to serve the social and emotional needs of more than 500 students at McCurdy Charter School and approximately 20 McCurdy Ministries Preschoolers! We have been pretty busy, to say the least, and without any student interns from NM Highlands University we weren't able to offer our Buddy Service-Learning Program.

Then in January, we were joined by Matilda Fernandez, MSW Intern who agreed to come on board for three semesters! Thankfully she agreed to resurrect the Buddy Program and had a great start this semester recruiting and interviewing three middle school applicants and helping with their Safe Sanctuary Training. She also accepted and interviewed three elementary school referrals and will be matching them with the Big applicants next semester, along with continued mentorship training, scheduling weekly visits and supervising these visits.

In the fall, I was honored to participate with Sarah Allen, our Development Director, in the Faith Talks Podcast by the United Methodist Women about our Hispanic Culture in Española and the McCurdy Community. It was a great opportunity to share this part of our community with so many others, helping them to understand this part of us and hopefully encourage more and continued participation of Volunteers in Mission at McCurdy Ministries Community Center.

Bill and I were able to actively engage with all 52 students and families that were referred to us for support this year for a total of 1281.5 direct service hours this year. Of those, 797.5 were devoted to working individually with students on our caseloads and 224 were devoted to supporting their parents, helping establish a strong safety net for these students. We also provided 18.5 hours of crisis intervention for students who needed immediate support during the school day so that they were helped in finding relief. Some of the issues we worked with this year included grief and loss with students who lost a parent and teacher, divorce, co-parenting, depression and anxiety, impulse control, bullying, post traumatic stress disorders, adoption and adjustment, anger management, and sex orientation and identity, to name a few. In addition, we were invited to provide classroom presentations for the second, third and fourth grades on Project Cariño Introduction, establishing and maintaining healthy relationships and the safe use of technology.

Through all of this, we were honored to work in collaboration with several McCurdy Charter School administrators, teachers, and staff members; we couldn't have done any of it without their help! Project Cariño always works closely with Principal Bernadette Tixier-French in providing emotional support for students; our collaboration is key in the success of our mutual students! Ms. Anna Espinosa was especially helpful to all of us at Project Cariño, always lending a helping hand with a smile and good cheer. As the only Administrative Assistant for the whole school, she always has her hands full, and we know how much we asked of her every day!

Project Cariño was honored for the invitation to support students who grieved the loss of a special Education Assistant, Ms. Pearl Valdez, in the spring. Ms. Amy Miller was very thoughtful and supportive of students who were close to Ms. Pearl, making sure they were able to receive grief support from Project Cariño. We also worked with Ms. Amanda Padilla, Ms. Lorraine Rivera, and Director Sarah Tario in honoring Ms. Valdez's legacy at McCurdy Charter by planting trees in her honor on campus.

Bill and I are thankful for another great year in the service of McCurdy Charter School Community through Project Cariño and we are proud to have this opportunity to contribute to our students' educational success!
